### About the School of the Albany Berkshire Ballet

The School of the Albany Berkshire Ballet is known for its outstanding, balanced dance curriculum. Director Madeline Cantarella Culpo founded the School of Dance in 1955 with the goal of providing personal attention and training for students and professional dancers.

Graduates have gone on to dance with the Albany Berkshire Ballet, Joffrey Ballet, American Ballet Theatre, Jacob's Pillow and the Pennsylvania, Idaho, Ohio, Portland, and Washington Ballets.

The School teaches the Cecchetti method of ballet developed by Enrico Cecchetti, world renowned teacher of the Ballet Russes and ballet master of Diaghilev Ballet Russes, who trained such dancers as Pavlova, Fokine, and Nijinsky. Among his protégés was English ballerina Margaret Craske, who later taught at the Juilliard School and at Jacob's Pillow. From Miss Craske, Madeline Cantarella Culpo developed her technique.

### **Academy and Junior Company Program**

The Academy Program of the School of the Albany Berkshire Ballet is a comprehensive training program for the talented and serious

pre-teen to teen student who desires to commit more time to the art of dance. Advanced students may audition for the Albany Berkshire Ballet's Junior Company. These pre-professional classes accelerate talented students and expose them to nationally known teachers. Both the Academy and the Junior



Company perform frequently in the Capital Region and the Berkshires throughout the year. Admission is by audition only. This year, the Program will tentatively begin in January.

### The Curriculum


A Note to Parents: Students are placed by their instructor into the appropriate level. Please respect the placement of your student by their instructor. As each student's development is different, students and parents should expect to spend at least two years at each level.

<u>Pre-Ballet 1</u> (3 & 4 years old) Creative movement encompassing stretching, motor coordination, music appreciation and rhythm. \*Pre-Ballet students must be 3 years

\*Pre-Ballet students must be 3 years old and potty-trained to start— No Exceptions

Pre-Ballet 2 (5& 6 years)

A continuation of Pre-Ballet 1 with an introduction to basic ballet steps.



Ballet I and 2 (8 years old and up) The basics of ballet barre and center work are taught with emphasis on proper placement and body alignment. Each level builds on material learned in the previous level with more complex musicality, rhythm, and physical movements added as the student progresses.

Ballet 3 through Advanced Levels—Emphasis on strengthening technique with new steps introduced at each level. Total body awareness becoming an integral part of development. Combination steps, speed, more advanced skills and musicality and lyricism are reinforced at these levels.\* Serious dance students are encouraged to study more frequently in preparation for pointe work and men's technique.

<u>Pointe</u> (11 years old and up with teacher approval) All pointe students are strongly encouraged to take ballet class twice a week. Pointe work requires strength, ankle flexibility and correct alignment. Students are recommended for pointe work on an individual basis at the discretion of the director and will begin in technique class (Ballet 3 or 4). Students will be recommended to take hour class, Pointe 1, per the director.



<u>Placements</u>: Students will be placed in classes that are appropriate for their level of physical development and maturity. Placement decisions are made by the Director and are final.

Make-up Lessons: Make-up lessons are offered for absence due to illness and must be used within one month of absence. Tuition credit is not given in place of make-up lessons. Please call the school when you are going to be absent. Snow days are factored into the tuition, however if you wish to make up a class, you may do so in the same level or with approval from your current teacher.

Private Lessons: Private lessons are available and must be arranged through the office administrator at SABB.

<u>Closings</u>: If the school closes due to inclement weather an email will be sent out, a post on Facebook or the website. Please check your local radio or television stations for updates throughout the day. A message will also be left on the studio phone.

Notices: Notices will be posted at the studio as well as emailed to our families Please check to make sure your email address is on file as this will be our main form of communication.

### **Recital and Costume Fees:**

Our annual recital will take place on Sunday, June 6th, 2021. Although it is not mandatory, we encourage student participation as it is a rewarding experience and builds confidence.

Pointe/Variations For advanced pointe dancers, this class offers additional pointe training, while learning traditional female variations from Classical Ballets.

**Partnering** (Approval by Director is needed for this class.) Partnering class will teach the basics of partnered turns, lifts, jumps, and promenades. Seasonal.



Modern Dance (8 years and up) Dance form based on fundamental ballet training and focusing on the modern dance techniques of Martha Graham, Jose Limon, and Lester Horton. Free form movement done in bare feet.

Tap (8-12 years old) This class builds upon the basic foundation of Tap Dance, creating rhythmic sounds and foot patterns, improvisations and syncopation. Dancers need tap shoes for this class.
